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HAM AND PEACH DINNER



Ham & Peach Dinner is scheduled for Sunday, August 4, 2024. David **Donley is the Chairperson. We've already made excellent progress in pre**paring for the event. The spiced peaches were made June 20th. The worker list and schedule were published July 9th by email. This is a complex meal and we have workdays scheduled starting July 31st.

- Wednesday, July 31, Peach Sauce Day, starts 8 am
- Thursday, August 1, Potato Day, starts 8 am
- Friday, August 2, Peaches and Potato Salad Day, starts 8 am
- Saturday, August 3, Pre-Service Setup and Food Preparation Day, starts 8 am
- Sunday, August 4, Service Day, start times vary by job

Worker Meal policy change: Any Granger who works 4 to 8 hours over the course of preparation and service will get their meal for \$9 (half price). Grangers working more than 8 hours get a free meal on Sunday.

If you don't see your name on the worker list, feel free to show up and help anyway. Your hours will be credited.

Turkey Hill Grange Food Service

We will provide fair food during the "Renner Farm Show". This is a great opportunity that comes around every-other year. In 2022 we earned over \$14,000 net for Turkey Hill Grange. We expect to do better this year. We need maximum participation from Grange members to make this event a success. Charles Terser is the Chairperson for this major fundraiser.

Setup: Renner's provides a garage in a prime location for us to set up a fair food kitchen and serving area. We will start setup early in August and continue through Tuesday, 26 August. Set up includes moving refrigerators, freezers, deep fryers, stoves and a flat top from Turkey Hill and Emerald Mound Granges and setting up Charles' trailer near the facility. Also shopping and stocking food and paper and packaging is underway. Meanwhile the Turkey Hill kitchen will be busy preparing food in advance. Watch for set up schedule in your e-mail and lend a hand whenever you can.

Service: We will start food service on Wednesday, 27 August, for setup workers. Mr. Renner has invited local 5th Graders to come visit the farm on Thursday, 28 August. We plan to serve them. Regular service will start Friday, 29 August and continue through Sunday, 31 August. On September 1st, we'll continue to serve food for cleanup workers.

Cleanup: Cleanup duty starts about an hour before closing time each day. Some pots and pans may need to make the trip to Turkey Hill for cleaning and preparation for the next day's service. Starting 2 September we will remove our left over food and goods from Renner's. Also, we will disassemble our kitchen and serving areas and return the equipment to the Granges. We expect to be done in two days. Again, look for clean up schedule in your e-mail.

The Graces

Sitting at the front of the Grange Hall facing the altar are the three Graces, Ceres, Pomona, and Flora. These are three of the four jobs that must be filled by Sisters of the Order—a notable rule for an organization started in the 19th century. The primary duties of Ceres, Pomona and Flora are participation in initiations, degree work, and general cooperation with other Grange Officers. The Graces provide a tie to the agricultural history and foundation of the Grange.

The ancient Greeks and Romans worshipped Ceres, Pomona and Flora, as goddesses. To them Ceres (Greek: Demeter) was the goddess of agriculture, fertility, grains, harvest, motherhood, and cultivated crops. Pomona (Greek: Opora) was the goddess of fruitful abundance and plenty. Flora (Greek: Chloris) was the goddess of flowers and spring.

In the Grange we place a "Sister of the Order" in these presiding positions to show our respect for them and our regard for agriculture. We encourage the Graces to enlarge their sphere of thought and action, and to elevate their aims and character; and ask them in turn to grace our meetings with their presence and counsel, and thus refine our manners and improve our lives.

Ceres presides over our sacred rites to encourage our members to labor with diligence and prudence. Her symbols are grain and the sickle, reminders of God's bounty, and of man's duty to garner that bounty, carefully and gratefully.

Pomona lends special attention to fruits. She urges cultivation and improvement of fruits. She reminds members that the best in kind and quality can never become too abundant. She also points out that no trees bear fruit in Autumn which do not blossom in the Spring. That life may be profitable, laden with good fruits, let all endeavor that youth be studious and virtuous, replete with the blossoms of observation and study—the promise of future wisdom and usefulness.

Flora encourages members to cultivate flowers—the most beautiful expressions of the Creator's goodness—and to adorn their homes with flowers. "Their purifying and refining influences are needed by all, and their cultivation cannot but elevate the thoughts and refine the tastes of all who thus study and cultivate their graceful forms and beautiful colors"

Out of respect we do not walk between the Graces and the Altar when the Grange is in session, except as part of a ceremony.
