I happened to check my inventory and it was one I did not have. The next item is a book called: Rich Harvest: A History of the Grange, 1867-1900. It is a hard cover book, signed by the author D. Sven Nordin. It was printed in 1974. The paper cover has pictures of all the seven founders. I have never seen this book before. I had to add it to my Grange book collection. I have a few more items to come, so I will write about them next time.

I am working on the Grange Halls book. I have decided to arrange them by county so it will be easier to add to. I used mapquest satellite view to check a couple former Grange hall sites. Some buildings are still there, some are not. I found township office buildings, commercial buildings, churches, homes, travel agency, and a fire station, just to name a few.

On February 15 I was invited to Union Grange meeting. I presented a Grange historical program. I shared the two scrapbooks of their Grange, thanks to Sally, Darl and Vivian for their photos and items.




